Jack	A padded jerkin worn as a basic armour in its own right or as an underlay for other armour. Covers: - Torso, Groin, Hips, Arms Defence: 2; Encumbrance: 1
Brigandine	A jack with plates of metal either sewn onto or into the torso, offering excellent location protection at a price point. The other parts are padded in the same way as a Jack.  Covers: - Torso (Plate): Groin, Hips, Arms (Padded)  Defence: 4; Encumbrance 4
Haubergeon	A mail shirt. Assumes a jack worn underneath. Covers: Torso, Upper Arms, to Thigh Defence: 4; Encumbrance 3
Camail	A mail cope that hangs down over chest and upper arms. It offers good protection for the upper body at a much lower price point than the Haubergeon. Assumes a jack worn underneath. Covers: Shoulders, Chest, Upper Arms, Gut but not Flanks Defence 3; Encumbrance 3
Jezeraint	Fine mail haubergeon that comes with its own soft leather arming coat and does not require a jack. It does not cover quite the same area as a haubergeon but is lighter and may be worn discreetly under a jupon (tunic). Usually made to measure.  Covers: Torso, Shoulders  Defence: 3; Encumbrance: 2
Chausse	Mail leggings. Covers: Legs Defence: 2; Encumbrance 2
Half Cuirass	Breast plate of beaten metal. Covers: Chest, Gut Defence 4; Encumbrance 2
Full Cuirass	Breast and back plate. Covers: Chest, Gut, Back Defence 4; Encumbrance 2

- This is the age of plate-mail and there are many other component pieces of armour that allow a soldier to arm themselves cap a pied in plate armour over a haubergeon and chausse. These have no Defence bonus but do offer substantial protection to the specific location.
- Encumbrance reduces movement and Agility-based defence. These can be offset by the Skill Armouring. When the weather is hot (which it often is in Rome) Encumbrance may lead to Hit Point penalties. These are not offset by Armouring.
